# IT TAKES A COMMUNITY

With your support, Tri-Lakes Cares served so many neighbors in need in Northern El Paso County!

## 755 households= 1,268 individuals

## How does that breakdown?

- 475 adults
- 314 youth
- 479 senior citizens
- 38 veterans
- 152 persons living with disabilities



71 households received Housing Assistance in the form of rent or mortgage payments, valued at \$117,670.



286,660 pounds of food were distributed through all of our Food Insecurity programs & shared with partner organizations.



54 households had help with utility payments, valued at \$25,033.



Bus tickets, gas cards, car repair, and preventative maintenance, valued at \$51,705 helped keep client vehicles operating safely.



The Neighborhood Nurse Center, a collaboration with Penrose-St. Francis, provided individuals with financial assistance and referrals for dental and vision needs, mental health counseling, doctor's visits and help with prescription payments, valued at \$82,291.

TLC's Top Fy22 Achievements

#### MARKET REMODEL

Reworked the Market square footage and items in our Market to better serve our clients with the "client choice model." Clients now shop from the Market making their own choices on items they want and need. Our systems are now automated, offering online ordering and more effective tracking methods.

#### SPECIAL PROGRAMS

In the summer of 2022, we provided over 420 youth with muchneeded school supplies. Additionally, 63 seniors and 99 youth were served in our Giving Tree program, providing holiday gifts for all.

### **CASE MANAGEMENT**

Our team's primary focus is on moving clients toward greater stability. We started incorporating assessments and ISPs (Individualized Service Plans), allowing us to identify barriers and greatest needs for our clients while tracking their progress.

### **DEVELOPMENT**

We held another successful Taste of Tri-Lakes Cares event, along with the Empty Bowls Silent Auction. Through events, grants, and private donations, we exceeded our fundraising goals for the year, allowing us to keep up with the increased demand and provide more resources and food for our clients in need.





## Pandemic Comparison of Direct Client Support


